## TIPS:

- Design your garden for continuous flowering between May and October
- Provide water source (pond, bird bath, shallow tray)
- Grow nectar-bearing plants in areas of full sun exposure
- Leave undisturbed bare ground, hollow sticks and dead wood for bees
- Avoid use of pesticides and insecticides

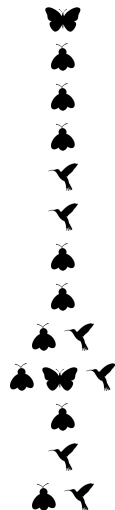

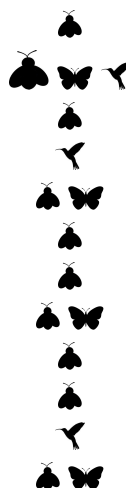
